STUDENT RESOURCE SCHEME 2019

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome you back to an exciting year at Cairns State High and also extend a sincere welcome to all of our new families.

This document provides some information that will assist you with the financial aspects of education at Cairns State High School. The Student Resource Scheme is a non-profit scheme that operates solely to benefit students and parents by substantially reducing the financial burden of purchasing expensive resources.

Textbook and Resource Allowance.

The State Government pays a Textbook and Resource Allowance (TRA) to assist with offsetting the cost of education. The values of the TRA for 2018 are a one off allowance:

- \$127 for Year 7-10 students and
- \$276 for Year 11 and 12 students

The Government asks schools to facilitate payment of the allowance to families. At Cairns State High School we opt to have the State Government's TRA credited against the first invoice of each school year; therefore the following will happen:

Year 10

- Value of the Student Resource Scheme = General Levy \$727 (Including the BYOx Enhancement Costs);
- Less the value of Textbook and Resource Allowance of \$127;
- *The difference of \$600 will appear on your statement and will be payable by parents.*

Year 11 & 12

- Value of the Student Resource Scheme = General Levy \$876 (Including the BYOx Enhancement Costs);
- Less the value of Textbook and Resource Allowance of \$276;
- *The difference of \$600 will appear on your statement and will be payable by parents.*

Years 7, 8 & 9

- Value of the Student Resource Scheme = General Levy \$647 (Including the BYOx Enhancement Costs);
- Value of Textbook and Resource Allowance is \$127;
- *The value of \$520 will appear on your statement and will be payable by parents.*

(For your information, due the limitations of our statewide finance system we are unable to display the credit applied to the general levy on the statements sent home to you. This would be our preferred option of management as it would clearly show you the charge and then the credit but unfortunately we are unable to do so)

General Levy

The General Levy is comprised of costs to cover your student's diary/study planner, ID Card, Senior Badges, textbooks/resources, eTextbook subscriptions, consumables and other personal resources for students. This is a voluntary scheme; however, most families elect to join, due to the convenience and reduced financial commitment.

Bring Your Own x (Mobile Device) Program (BYOx)

eLearning at Cairns State High School is embedded within the whole school approach to curriculum delivery. Contemporary learners demand seamless delivery between school and home and the school is responding to this demand by providing 24/7 access to teaching and learning materials through the Learning Place.

To support eLearning, Cairns State High School has a program that requires all students to bring their own laptop to school. The students in Year 7 to 12 will have a P&C approved Enhancement Cost applied to their fees for services over and above what the government provides. This allows students access to:

- Library Online portal – 24/7 access to digital resources and online databases
- Clickview Online digital video library
- ReadCloud subscription and eTextbook Platform
- Online databases – Weblinks, Proquest eLibrary, Gale Virtual Reference Library
- Range of software for specific curriculum use including Adobe Creative Suite, AutoCAD, Lego Robotics
- Printing
- Onsite IT Support for students and parents
- Software development to enhance access, communications and eLearning
- Access to short term replacement device to ensure continuity of learning whilst own laptop is being repaired (by approved application only) and
- Development and maintenance of BYOx connector.

What If I Don't Want To Join The Scheme?

If you choose not to participate in the Student Resource Scheme, **you would be required to supply all resources used by your student (incl. textbooks/resources, eTextbook subscriptions)**. You would need to contact each of your child's teachers for a list of items to be purchased (alternatively we have provided a provisional list for Non-Participating).

You would apply for the Textbook and Resource Allowance (TRA) due for your student/s by completing an application form. You would be invoiced and required to pay a nominal fee of **\$492** for Years 7 to 10 or **\$575** for Years 11 & 12 to cover ID card, student diary planner, library access, whole school sports, use of reproduced class materials, workshops, computer items, audio and videotapes, student work books purchased by the school for student use during the course, wellbeing program charges etc and the BYOx Enhancement Cost.

If you opt to have the State Government's Textbook and Resource Allowance credited against the first invoice of the school year; the following will happen:

Year 7, 8, 9 & 10

- Value of Non-Participation = \$492 (Including BYOx Enhancement Cost)
- - Value of Textbook and Resource Allowance is \$127
- *The difference of **\$365** will be payable by parents*

Year 11 & 12

- Value of Non-Participation = \$575 (Including BYOx Enhancement Cost)
- - Value of Textbook and Resource Allowance is \$276
- *The difference of **\$299** will be payable by parents*

***Subject Specific Charges would also have to be paid.

Subject Fees & Charges for Certificate Courses

Additional Subject Specific charges are invoiced in week 4 of Term 1. Some subject fees also includes the cost of excursions and activities that are associated with the student's chosen subjects. The school sought and received approval from the school's P&C Association to include excursion costs in subject fees. The rationale for this is to negate the need to continually ask parents for money for costs that have a direct link to learning for the students.

Subject fees pay for the resources, hardware and consumables utilised in the classroom and the values for these are approved by the school's P&C Association at the end of each year for the following year.

Some of our senior subjects now provide students with access to Certificate/Diploma Level courses. These costs vary depending on the Registered Training Organisation (RTO) which is providing the accreditation. Parents will be advised of these costs via communication from the school's Head of Senior Pathways Coordinator and/or Heads of Department.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme is an international, academically challenging and balanced program of education that prepares students, aged 16 to 19, for success at university and life beyond.

The annual cost of enrolling in the IB Diploma Programme is set by Education Queensland. This amount is currently **\$2,312 per year** and is in addition to other year level fees and charges i.e. Parents will need to pay an **additional \$600** for the Student Resource Scheme. Please be aware that this IB fee may increase.

A non-refundable registration fee is charged, securing a place in the course in Year 10 and is deducted from the Year 11 IB fee.

Family Discounts

Families paying fees for three or more siblings attending the school can make application to the Business Services Manager to receive a 20% discount on the scheme charges for the third and subsequent children.

Items Other Than Subject Fees

Several items may require payment directly to reception for students interested in participating as they will not be invoiced. These may include:

- Excursion Costs - These are established by the Heads of Department and will relate directly to the curriculum and are either included in the subject fee, invoiced for as they arise or are paid on an interested students only basis directly to reception.
- Lockers - Students will be notified of locker availability via Daily Notices. Application forms and payments are made at reception.
- Euroka School Magazine - The Annual Magazine provides a long and memorable record of this year's school life and is greatly valued by past and present students.
- Junior School Activities - During the course of the school year, our Junior students will be offered opportunities to participate in recreational activities. Participation in these events is dependent on all outstanding financial accounts being paid in full or parents having instigated a part payment plan in advance of the activity.
- Competitions - Students interested in participating in competitions are instructed to make payment at reception to secure their position.
- Senior Shirt and Senior Jersey - The Year Level Coordinator will instruct students interested in placing an order timelines in which to make payment at reception.
- Year 10 Informal or Year 12 Formal - Costs for these Senior School activities are calculated by the venues. The cost will comprise venue hire, decorations, security, photography and catering. Participation in these events is dependent on all outstanding financial accounts being paid in full or parents having instigated a part payment plan in advance of the activity.
