#### Our initiatives include

- Intensive support and class arrangements for students with learning gaps in literacy development
- Trialling a student coach for junior secondary engagement
- Improving engagement with individualised planning, tracking and monitoring.
- Supporting career awareness, goal setting and planning
- Providing connections to future career options for students
- Incresing the extension opportunities for students.

#### Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employment of paraprofessionals to provide students with in class support
- Further develop our pastoral carer program through formalisation of the Connect program for students in Years 7-10 and programs to enhance the learning of students in Year 11 and 12.
- Purchase training packages to embed into the Career Connect program in Year 10 to earn a QCE point.
- Employ a staff member to track and support improved attendance.
- Support the development of programs in Senior School VET by employment of a support officer for School Based training and apprenticeships.
- Subsidise Year 10 Career Connect Work experience placement fees.
- Techer and leadership positions to support behaviour, learning and extension opportunities.
